FF&E for Great Ormond Street's Award-Winning Sight & Sound Centre

Kier Construction delivered this £25 million refurbishment and extension of the listed Italian Hospital on Queen Square, near Great Ormond Street. The building is now the Sight & Sound Clinic, helping children with sight and hearing difficulties.

Working alongside the architects and contractors, Hygenius (then WorkSpace Design) supplied the full FF&E package, including a range of bespoke joinery, from a smart panelled reception desk and wall screen to the fitted seating, teapoints and activity walls to keep patients occupied while waiting.

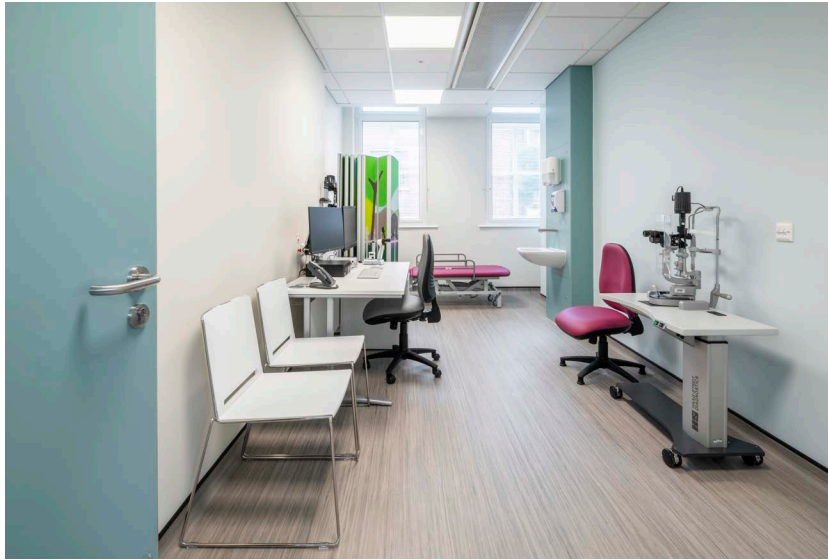
